

As ride managers of the PonyXpress, Mary Hanson and I start planning early, using the forms provided by NATRC. There are checklists reminding us to get our park permits, our insurance and other pertinent information for the ride. We spend a lot of time at the park prior to the ride checking and mapping trails and clearing and marking those same trails. However, we are always nervous about having enough volunteers to help manage the continuity of the ride.

In Nebraska, our distance riding club, Nebraska Endurance and Competitive Ride Assoc. sponsors the PonyXpress and the Indian Cave CTR and those members provide the bench strength of our volunteers. 

The exercises and stretches presented will be valuable, but I was most impressed with what she stressed as Mental Focus. I quote, "Come to the ride prepared to fulfill your role as your horse's leader (benevolent alpha) prepared to commit positive and unwavering attention to the job at hand. It means that you recognize the importance of the practice-continuous awareness of our body position and your horse's movements." We can have chairs, exercise balls; balance platforms and bands available for her to have participants come to the platform and do hands-on demonstrations. We could even have the stretch bands for sale.

"Wrapping Your Mind Around Trail Obstacles" Cheri Jeffcoat, NATRC Horsemanship Judge from Region 6, President's Cup winner 2010, Past President of NATRC

Cheri continues to instruct riders through clinics in Tennessee and Alabama following her move to Region 5 in 2016. She will discuss "Wrapping Your Mind Around Trail Obstacles" as she shares the technique of controlling your mental and physical approach to performing trail obstacles (opportunities) during competition. 


