Conditioning

What more can be written about conditioning that hasn't already been said? We've all heard about Long Slow Distance Training. Build a solid foundation. Improve aerobic metabolic capacity. Consistency is key. Starting this training, one must assume the rider is conditioned as well. Right?

Have you ever looked at a horse slowly losing it's winter coat and thought "he certainly has wintered well." Not much to do but stand around the hay bale. Well, coming into spring I can certainly relate. Obviously I have bellied up to too many buffets over the holiday season and in order to get the horse in shape, I need to follow the same conditioning plan.

Long Slow Distance Training should come easy; we are longing to ride. Dodging the rain storms is making the "long" part of the training take even longer and admittedly, at about 10 miles, I am done. There is no foundation building when all we have is mud. While I

am certainly not one to damn Mother Nature over moisture, it would be most helpful if the rain could start about noon on Monday and be finished by early Thursday.

Improve aerobic metabolic capacity. When I think "aerobic", I think cardio. I don't know about you but just carrying a hale bale from the barn to the trailer is about as much cardio as I can take. The thought of trotting for 10 miles; oh, my! Since I started competing and learned my riding is a very important factor in the horse/rider team, I am the first to criticize someone I see simply being a passenger; sitting back on that saddle and letting the horse grunt up the hill. I feel like that person today. Getting up and out of the saddle requires me to be in condition. And starting with something as easy as jumping jacks and building up to an aerobic workout will help ready me for the strength training needed to be that better rider for my horse.

Getting ourselves conditioned for the ride season is as important as getting our horse ready. For some, it is just getting in shape while others need diet and exercise to excel in our sport. In a perfect world, an exercise regimen should continue all year so we don't find ourselves with a "hay belly" come spring. Okay, okay. I've convinced myself. Now just do it!

It's not about our weight card but doing what's best for our riding partner: our horse.

Team Tate

It didn't take much arm twisting to get Dwight Hanson to do his first CTR at the Turkey Trot at Turkey Creek in the fall of 2013. Dwight had been riding his home raised gaited Morgan, Silver Valley Tate, on the trails since he came home from the trainer and Dwight was looking forward to taking it up a notch.

Mary and Dwight have been riding, driving and breeding Morgans for decades and they fancied the idea of a gaited Morgan. Mary had hoped for a nice 15hh colt that she could ride and drive. They got the colt, but he didn't stop growing and it soon became obvious that size-wise, he might be more fitted for Dwight.



Dwight had a successful first ride at Turkey Creek and went on to compete at Kanopolis that same year. It wasn't long before both husband and wife caught the CTR bug. And it was obvious that Tate was well suited to the sport. Even on the hottest days, this black gelding would come in with such low P & Rs that a lot of volunteers are unsure if they may have missed a respiration or two. Mary assures them they did not. That is just Tate.



In 2015, Mary stole Tate from her husband and competed him in Competitive Pleasure that season, earning his first National Championship as well as CP Grand Champion High Average Horse. In November, Mary moved Tate into Open and was not surprised at his continued good performance.


Dwight is a world-traveler (literally) and his work takes him out of the country. While he competed on Tate when he could, Mary also put in some rides as well as Sarah Rinne. Tate garnered his Open National Championship in 2016. Mary and Dwight knew Tate was strong enough to go the distance and with the right rider, they wanted to send him to the Tevis Cup. They knew the right rider was Sarah. Game on!

Mary, retired from the National Park Service, took Tate to Florida in early 2017 to begin conditioning. Sarah flew out and did two back to back endurance rides on Tate. The second day, he came in 7th of 27 riders. The NATRC season was underway and Sarah and Tate entered as many as they could, traveling to Texas and Oklahoma in the early season as well as the Sandhills in Kansas. To date, they have competed in six CTRs and 2 endurance rides. Tate and Sarah placed first at Pole Canyon, TX. He has had 3 second placings and 2 thirds. At a recent ride, Sarah was not comfortable with an obstacle and instead chose to do what was best for the horse. While the point loss put her in 3rd place, she says there is never a question that the horse comes before the points. Sarah walks the talk.

With that said, Tate is currently on a 30-day rest following some tenderness in his leg. If he checks out with the vet after his rest, he will be back on the CTR trail with Tevis in mind. If he doesn't, then perhaps another year. It's been a fun year of collaboration and travel for Dwight, Mary and Sarah. You can follow Team Tate on Facebook.

The Bev Roberts National Horsemanship Champion honors Open and Competitive Pleasure (CP) riders who have achieved five National Championships (NC's) on five different horses. The national championships may be all in Open, all in CP, or a combination of Open and CP championships.

In the 38 years of NC awards, only four riders have qualified for this ward. They are Nancy Diamond in 1992, Terri Smith in 2004, Bev Roberts in 2007, and Bill Hinkebein in 2008. The retroactive honorees received certificates. From 2013 forward, winners receive a signed and numbered framed print of artwork created by Bev Roberts.

In 2016, Bill Hinkebein achieved the fifth of five NC's on another five different horses. Bill is the first to receive the

award twice; this is 10 NC's on 10 different horses!

Bill Hinkebein received the Bev Roberts National Horsemanship Champion award titled Take Five from Bev. At rides, Bill sports a feather in his cowboy hat. Bev's "forever fiancee", JD Mullins, teases Bill about his feathers whenever he sees Bill and has even supplied him with a feather when Bill lost one. The feather attached to the frame was a special touch by JD just for Bill.
