- 4. Our mentoring committee has reached out to the contacts we made at this year's EquiFest. Margaret Reynolds followed up with an email to every individual. Once our rides resume this committee will be in contact again with these potential new riders.

- 9. Another 2020 NATRC Coronavirus Response Challenge that is rolling out is the 2020 NATRC Mileage Challenge. Log the miles you ride with a GPS between May 1 to Nov 1. Awards will go to the top 6 mileages! Entry fee is \$25 for one horse and \$10 for each additional horse ridden. You must be a NATRC member to participate. Email natrc@natrc.org to enroll and send your entry fee to the national office. Let us see if our Region 6 riders can log the most miles!
- 10. The third 2020 NATRC Coronavirus Response Challenge is an Obstacle Challenge! These start May 1st. Participants will be divided into four brackets. Riders with more than 1,500 NATRC miles, Riders with less than 1,500 miles, brand new members with 0 NATRC miles, and Juniors 17 and under. Enter monthly (\$10) or enter by April 30th to compete in all five months (\$40). A new set of five obstacles will be issued each month. Video yourself and receive feedback/tips from five NATRC judges on EACH obstacle what a deal! The judging panel will watch each submitted video and score it on a scale of 1-10 and provide feedback/tips. The top six point earners across five moths will win awards.
