Ride management made sure that everyone left with a smile as well as with some goodies. Saturday's ride included seven first time riders who gained valuable experience which will pay great dividends in the upcoming ride season.

The end of the month is this Saturday so be sure to get all your GPS tracks submitted by then! Miles only count if ridden on or before October 31 AND submitted by the end of the day on November 1st. Our Region is fortunate to have so many individuals willing to serve and do whatever is needed for the betterment of our region and the sport we all love! - 8. Although we just experienced a little snow and some colder weather, it looks like there is still going to be some favorable riding weather ahead which means there can still be some "pop up" rides. If you have any plans to go ride and/or camp somewhere please give a shout out to everyone. These "pop up" rides are a great opportunity to check out various ride locations and be able to spend time on the trail and around a campfire with our Region 6 family!

The specific details regarding this memorial will be sent to all 2021 ride managers. Donna's NATRC legacy is in great hands as you will find both her daughter Kay Stich and her granddaughter Violet Stich competing in Region 6 rides.
- 12. No decision has been made at this time regarding a 2021 Region 6 Convention. This will be an agenda item for the Region 6 Board of Directors at their next meeting. Usually our convention is held in person either in late February or March before the new ride season gets underway so we can celebrate the previous ride season. The convention usually includes a "knowledge" piece as well as an "awards" portion. We also conduct a membership meeting as well as board of directors meeting. The current thought is to wait until around the first of the year to make a decision so that we can make a more informed decision, especially in regard to the virus situation. If there is a convention, there is a good possibility that it will look a little different this year. Instead of a Friday evening to Sunday morning convention it could become just a one day in person event. It could become a virtual convention with a knowledge piece as well as a membership meeting. In Missouri

Cedar Ridge Trails - I have someone who will co-manage this ride. Another great opportunity for anyone, especially a new ride manager.

In Iowa

White Rock Conservancy – good location in Iowa for many of our riders. I have someone willing to manage a ride in Iowa if someone will co-manage with them.

Stephens Forest – I have someone willing to manage if someone will co-manage with them. **Brushy Creek** – I have someone willing to manage if someone will co-manage with them.

We can do all of these, but we must have your help!!! There are other locations as well. You may have another location in mind. Regardless, please do not sit back and wait for someone else to step up. You will find managing a ride rewarding with many folks very willing to help. As a rider we benefit from those willing to manage a ride.

Previously, dues paid provided a membership that ran from the date the dues were paid. To get all memberships back on the January renewal date, those folks who paid after January 2020 will be contacted and provided a one-time prorated rate for 2021. IE: If you renewed in March 2020, you would have your 2021 dues prorated to cover April 2021 to December 2021 to get you back on a January renewal date. After that you will pay full dues in January 2022.
