 - a. Must have completed a minimum of 750 miles in any division.
 - b. Must have fulfilled the duties of horsemanship judge secretary.
 - c. Must have a thorough understanding of the Leisure Division Judge's and Management Manuals.
 - d. Must pass a written exam, and upon completion, must participate in an official Leisure Division Judge's training seminar.
 - e. Upon satisfactory completion of the above, the judges committee may approve the applicant as an apprentice judge.

f. Approved veterinary and horsemanship judges must participate in an official Leisure Division Judge's training seminar before judging the Leisure Division.

Serving as a NATRC judge is a rewarding experience. We are very fortunate in Region 6 to have outstanding Leisure Division Judges. Start the process now and join this excellent group.
