1. The most important ride of our entire ride season is the upcoming Region 6 Benefit ride. This year's benefit ride is the Hoofbeats in the Hills ride that will be held the weekend of October 30-31 at Hillsdale Lake near Paola, Kansas.

Your support for this ride will help provide our region with necessary funds for various regional activities including year-end awards, ride support (radios, rider vests, etc.), as well as NATRC awareness.

I challenge our entire membership to support this ride, either as a rider, a volunteer, or by simply sending in a donation to Region 6 if you are unable to attend.

If you cannot be there, donate the cost of a ride entry \$90, or donate the amount of a ride deposit \$30. Donate any amount you feel comfortable with and send your donation to Ruth Mesimer, 6818 N. Elm Street, Liberty, MO 64068. Make your check payable to Region 6 NATRC, Inc.

We did not have a benefit ride in 2020 and so it is even more important to have each member contribute in some way.

At this moment, I do not remember the exact number of Region 6 members but it is somewhere over 130 members. Let's just say if we had just 100 members send in \$10 each that would generate \$1,000 for our region. If those same 100 send in the cost of a ride deposit instead that would benefit our region by \$3,000.

Since I have given everyone this challenge, I will step up and match the first \$250 that Region 6 receives as donations, dollar for dollar. Who will match the next \$250?
