
This past ride year was so much fun. It was filled with many wonderful memories. From



Update of injured horses from Kansas fires:

I spoke with Dr Mack today and had received a note from Dr Harris a couple days ago.

The majority of the horses injured and treated locally have returned home.

Dr Mack stated Chip remains inpatient but is recovering well and should go home soon. He has been a very good patient. She feels his prognosis is good, with time.

Dr Mack has two Clydesdales in care but a discharge date is anticipated.

Dr Harris has discharged the Clydesdales under her care

Tim was treated by a third Vet, locally, and he was reportedly discharged after only a couple of days

Rainbow Meadows donated \$2500 to the care of the injured horses. According to Dr Mack, as a result of the generous support provided by many, she hopes not to bill for any of the horses she has treated.


My thoughts remain with those owners who lost their horses and other livestock and with the animals in recovery. Recovering from thermal injuries is a very long process.


