The results of the voting are as follows: Proposal 1 Ride season date adjustment (Passed), Proposal 2 Combine weight classes for 1 year and then reevaluate (Passed), Proposal 3 Improve consistency/clarity of eligibility for Novice and Leisure Adult (Passed), Proposal 4a Lower age of all junior competitors to 8 (Passed) thus 4b was not needed, Proposal 5 Junior competitor supervision requirements (Passed), and Proposal 6 Sanction language (Passed). Thank you to all the Region 6 members who shared their thoughts on these proposals.
