Note: This is a column I wrote for the newspaper, but I think everyone who has spent time with a horse can relate.

Without a doubt, I have never been so tired as I was on Friday afternoon.

Every morning we started in the sanctuary with music, drama and prayer. Every morning, Shana Ensz would make the experience fun.

"I know you're tired," she would say with just a touch of southern accent. "I'm tired too, but you can do hard things. Stand up and repeat after me - I can do hard things!"

It took me a minute to realize it, but she was right. We can all do hard things. In fact, while checking with my favorite resource for all things creative, (Pinterest) I found there is a whole "I can do hard things movement." Who knew?

In reality, I've known it for some time and feel like I've been doing hard things throughout my life, but last week I really needed to hear it.

May 30th was the ninth anniversary of my dad's passing after a struggle with cancer. My world changed forever with his death.

coming more intense and he was back in the hospital.

I have several friends that are hurting right now. A niece that is having some problems during pregnancy and other friends that are just at a loss for words because life is hard.

With all of the shootings and chaos in our world, it's a hard place to be sometimes.

I reminded myself of that as I sped to the farm at 10:00 on Friday evening with my husband and son in tow after getting a phone call that the cows were out.

(What is the deal with these cows anyway? They are belly deep in grass and they have to swim across the watershed to munch on beans that are less than two inches tall!)

Hard never comes for me at convenient times, but can we really plan for it?

Something tells me that somewhere during his 46-year career in law enforcement, my friend, now retired Chief of Police Bruce Lang, had a hard day or two. Probably several. But he kept going and what I always appreciated was his positive attitude.

I love this writer's perspective: "We don't learn a lot in seasons of comfort. We learn it in seasons of struggle."



October will be Election Time for National and Region NATRC Boards

1.) National Board of Director Election

The term of a NATRC director is 3 years. NBOD meetings are held monthly via Zoom and in person during the national convention, usually held in February.

Interested in running for the NATRC National Board of Director position? Contact Ruth Mesimer, Nominating Committee Chair, by September 30, 2022 for application; a bio sketch of 200 words or less will be needed for the ballot. This election is held by email and/or mail-in ballot. Ballot will be included in the September newsletter, voting to be completed by October 31. The winner of this election will be announced at the November NATRC Board of Directors meeting and the term will begin January 1, 2023.

This year Region 6 will need to fill a NATRC Board of Director position. Marla Stucky has held this position since 2020.

2.) Region 6 Board of Directors Election

The term of a Region 6 NATRC director is 2 years. Meetings held via Zoom and email.

Join in on the fun by signing up now to help Region 6 win this challenge for the third year in a row!


