NATRC Clinic (Saturday AM, April 22) Leisure Division Ride (Saturday PM & Sunday AM, April 22-23)

The clinic will start with rider check-in with Ride Secretary on Saturday April 22 at 9:00 am.

There will be unmounted instruction in the morning.

In the afternoon (approximately 2:00 pm), you will do a short ride (3 to 5 miles) with mentors and will learn how to do judged opportunities and P&R. The clinic ride will start with a practice check-in.

<u>The Leisure Division Ride</u> (LeD) will be offered after noon on Saturday, April 22, and Sunday, April 23. The LeD will start with check-in of horses starting at 9:00 am on Sunday. Time-out will start at 10:00 am. The distance will be 8 to 10 miles at a pace of approximately 3.5 mph. There will be one P&R (Pulse and Respiration check) and 3 to 5 judging observations. This division is NATRC sanctioned & NATRC members will earn points towards regional year-end awards & mileage.

Ride Notes: All competing out-of-state horses must have negative Coggins and current Health Certificate. Terrain is barefoot friendly. Dogs are not allowed in management area, check-in and briefings or at meals and must be leashed at all times (insurance requirement).

Directions: From Highway 79 at the Raymond Nebraska corner, take Raymond Road west for 6 miles. Turn right into Homestead Campground Area 2 and veer left to the equestrian campground.

Park Fees & Camping Facilities: Nebraska State Park Permit is required: \$31 annual or \$6 per day in state / \$62 annual or \$12 per day out-of-state and can be purchased online at https://ngpc-home.ne.gov/. This equestrian area offers 15 pull-through sites with electrical hookups reservable at the park office only, as well as 14 corrals. Call 402-783-3400 to reserve by the Thursday prior (no online reservations). The electric sites are \$25 per night; Horse pens are \$5 per day; Non-electric camping (basic) is \$15 per night per vehicle (at the time of this printing). Camping and park fees are NOT included in the entry fees. Please independently take care of all park fees. Hand-pump drinking water, toilets and fire rings are available in the equestrian camping area.

'Going Places Together' Horsemanship Clinic at Sand Hills With Travis Kennedy April 28-30, 2023

Sand Hills State Park, 4207 E. 56th Avenue, Hutchinson, KS 67502 Sanctioned by the North American Trail Ride Conference **12 Rider Limit**





Travis is from Hutchinson, Kansas. He started his career with horses at age 8 and started his first horse at age 14. Travis attended a clinic at Joe Wolter's ranch in Texas and it changed his entire outlook on horsemanship. For several years Travis returned to work with Joe. Joe Wolter worked for Ray Hunt and later became friends with Bill Dorrance and together they put on some of the first ranch roping clinics. Joe Wolter, Friend to Horse and Rider, is known for his deep understanding of horses and his patient, thoughtful approach to helping both horses and people. Through Travis's work with Joe Wolter, he learned there is a better way to work with horses.

Travis has spent 10-12 years training with and hosting clinics with Dave Weaver (The Original Californios). Dave is known for his classical horsemanship and California Bridle horse work. He focuses on horsemanship and how it applies to practical working situations.

Additionally, Travis has trained with Bryan Neubert. Bryan, who considers himself to be a continual student of horsemanship, also trained under Bill Dorrance, Ray Hunt and Tom Dorrance.

What to expect from the clinic with Travis Kennedy

- Clearer understanding and communication between you and your horse
- How to present things so your horse understands what you are asking from him so he will be a willing partner not a reactive tool

Travis believes, "Horses are more than a tool, by working with their minds you can get your ideas to be their ideas and they will want to be with you. This is a game changer on how you start and interact with horses."



Dogs: Not allowed at meals **and** must be on leash at all times in the park.

Clinic Fee - \$275.00 plus camping and park fees. Audit fee \$25.00/day or \$35 for weekend. Campsites with pens will need to be reserved by calling 316-542-3664 mention NATRC.

From the West on IA-141 drive through Coon Rapids and turn right (south) on N56/Fig Ave. Coming from the East on IA-141, drive through Bayard (small town) and turn left (south) on N56/Fig Ave. (There will be a large white Whiterock Conservancy sign at this intersection). Drive ~1.4 miles to 125th street on the left hand side of the road and turn left (east). The campground is the first right on the south side of 125th street.

Ride Notes: A current negative Coggins Certificate is required on all horses. A current Health Certificate (within 30 days of this event) is required on all out-of-state horses. **Dogs** are not allowed in management area, check-in and briefings areas and **must be leashed** at all times (insurance requirement).

Region 6 Competitive Trail Ride at Kanopolis Canyons June 3 - 4, 2023

Governed by the Rules of the North American Trail Ride Conference. Managed in 2023 by NECTRA.

Trails: Come out and enjoy well established trails and beautiful, unexpected scenery in the hills, canyons and prairie of north central Kansas.

Location: Kanopolis State Park, 200 Horsethief Rd, Marquette, KS 67464, just west of Lindsborg.

Directions: From north & east: I-70 west of Salina to Brookville exit; south to Brookville. At intersection of Hwy 140, turn west and continue to Hwy 141; turn south to Kanopolis Lake. Turn west into the state park, just before the dam, and follow signs to Rockin' K campsite. From west: I-70 east to Ellsworth exit; south to Hwy 140; turn east to Hwy 141, then turn south to Kanopolis Lake and continue as above. From south: I-135 north to exit 72, Lindsborg. Turn west and go to the end of the blacktop. Turn north to Lindsborg, then west on Hwy 4 approx. 18 miles to Hwy 141. Turn north to Kanopolis Lake and cross over the dam. Turn into state park, just past the dam, and follow signs to Rockin' K campsite.

Camping: Showers, toilets, horse water, and limited electrical and water hook-ups are available. Please make your own reservation for a campsite as soon as possible by contacting Kanopolis State Park at 785-546-2565. You will need to pay a reservation fee in advance; you can pay camping and utility fees when you come to the ride. A few campsites have been reserved for workers and management; contact Ride Chair to see if you are on that list. You only need reservations for Friday and Saturday nights, not Sunday, unless you plan to stay until Monday. Please note late arrival on your entry form.

Stabling: All horses will be stationary tied to hitching posts (unless there are enough pens for every horse to be in a pen). Leisure Division competitors may use the permanent pens at the park; they are available on a first come, first serve basis.

Potluck: Friday and Saturday evening, bring your own table service PLUS your favorite dish to share.

Ride Details: Late arrivals should make arrangements with ride management.
